Key vocabulary	Definition
Trust	Having confidence in someone or something.
Betrayal	Delivering or exposing someone to an enemy.
Forgiveness	To excuse someone when they do wrong.
Loyalty	Being committed and faithful.
Jerusalem	A holy city visited on pilgrimage by Jews. Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday.
Judas	The disciple who betrayed Jesus to the Roman soldiers.
Peter	One of Jesus disciples who denied Jesus.
Gethsemane	The garden where Jesus was arrested by the Roman soldiers.



After Jesus was arrested, Peter was asked if he knew him. Despite being one of his very close friends, Peter said 'No!' three times.

He then remembered what Jesus had said to him:

"Truly I tell you," Jesus answered, "this very night, before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times."
