

Key vocabulary	Definition
Trust	Having confidence in someone or something.
Betrayal	Delivering or exposing someone to an enemy.
Forgiveness	To excuse someone when they do wrong.
Loyalty	Being committed and faithful.
Jerusalem	A holy city visited on pilgrimage by Jews. Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday.
Judas	The disciple who betrayed Jesus to the Roman soldiers.
Peter	One of Jesus disciples who denied Jesus.
Gethsemane	The garden where Jesus was arrested by the Roman soldiers.

Despite being a close friend of Jesus, Judas Iscariot betrayed Jesus. He led the soldiers to him and revealed who he was by kissing him on the cheek.
