


Why do Christians celebrate the Eucharist?




Key vocabulary	Definition
Eucharist	A Christian service, ceremony, or sacrament commemorating the Last Supper, in which bread and wine are consecrated and consumed.
Holy Communion	Another name for Eucharist.
Last Supper	The final meal that Jesus shared with his disciples
	in Jerusalem before his crucifixion. This day
	became known as Maundy Thursday.
Sacrifice	Jesus offering himself to be crucified.
Salvation	Being free from sin as a result of Jesus' death.
Sacrament	A Christian service that has consecrated elements.
Consecrated	To be made holy.

"...When He had given thanks, He broke [the bread] and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.' This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me'" (1 Corinthians 11:24-25).
